

The Dr. Margaret Hill Social Justice Award

Established February, 2022



On Sunday December 19, 2021, Dr. Margaret Hill passed away at the age of 81. Dr. Hill spent fifty years in education, touching the lives of thousands and ultimately making the world a much better place. She began her career in 1971 as a teacher in the San Bernardino City Unified School District. Dr. Hill then went on to become a vice principal at San Bernardino High School and later principal at San Andreas High School. Following this, she moved to the San Bernardino County Office of Education serving as Assistant Superintendent of Administrative Services. In 2011 Dr. Hill was elected to the Board of Education for the San Bernardino City Unified School District, serving the community until her passing. In addition to her work in the K-12 system, Dr. Hill also served as a professor at Cal State University, San Bernardino. Through her work there, she helped mold countless school administrators who serve our students today. Dr. Hill was an active and faithful member of ACSA Region 12, in recent years being recognized with Region 12's *Wilson Grace* and in another year Retiree of the Year awards for her continued service to the community. Dr. Margaret Hill kept the needs of the student at the center of everything she did throughout her career.

In order to keep her memory alive and to inspire others, Region 12 has added the *Dr. Margaret Hill Social Justice Award* to honor a leader that has a passion for helping our students succeed that goes above and beyond the norm. The recipient must be an active ACSA Region 12 member. Applications are due by 4:00 p.m. Friday, February 25. The recipient will be honored at the Region 12 *Spring Celebration* awards ceremony on May 2, 2022 at the Doubletree Hotel in Ontario.
