Clarity, advocacy, support to the field:

1. **Messaging:** CTE is about economic & workforce development + equity & access
2. **ACSA seeks input:** Strong Workforce is here to stay - field survey coming
3. **CTE Common Voice:** inform superintendents, community leaders & industry
4. **Credentialing:** flexibility for districts to hire from industry
5. **Accountability:** Council will get a seat on CDE's CA Dashboard work-group

Highlights from CDE guests:

1. **Grants:** CDE wants to simplify funding process/deliverables - need new PGMS
2. **Data collection:** Keep it reasonable, even as we've embraced new accountability
3. **CDE Telegraphed:** get ready for student-led enterprises & crossover with STEAM
4. **Rigor:** a-g, dual-credit, embedded academics---support ALL students to succeed
5. **"College Credit" clarity:** dual, articulated, w/ concurrent coming to CALPADS

Newcomer's Observation:

While CTE may vary by delivery model---ROPs, joint-powers, districts---we no longer compete for funding between these delivery models as in the days of categoricals. Common funding streams have brought folks together to advocate for one CA [CTE](#).
