At the region level, we recently completed a Superintendents' Vetting Session for the Contra Costa County Office of Education position on February 22, 2018. Three candidates: Lynn Mackey, Ron Leone and Cheryl Hansen were asked a series of questions with a panel and general audience viewing their responses. 


Diablo Valley Charter - Matt Chamberlain, President
