Retiree Charter Takes a Stand on Student Safety and Gun Violence

At the last luncheon meeting, our retirees in ACSA Region 6 had a presentation on the Sandy Hook Promise and work being done in the schools in our region. The Sandy Hook Promise Program "trains students and adults to know the signs of gun violence so that no other parent experiences the senseless horrific loss of their child". They are working across the U.S. to change the culture in our schools to

make our students feel safer, but it is not enough, there have been more than 33 gun violence incidents since the tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary School in December 2012.

SANDY HOOK PROMISE, "I promise to do all I can to protect children from gun violence by encouraging and supporting solutions that create safer, healthier homes, schools, and communities."

As retired school administrators we believe that we can do more to protect the safety of our students. We can no longer sit on the sidelines waiting for others to take action. We must make a greater effort in stopping the gun violence. We need to push for stronger laws. As a result, the retired administrators in Region 6 has created the following resolution:

As retired school administrators in ACSA Region 6, we resolve to provide greater safety for our students. We believe that the safety of our students continues to be threatened by gun violence. It goes beyond improved mental health and awareness programs, increased lock-down drills and school safety measures. We believe we need stronger gun laws and background checks on those people purchasing guns. We believe the laws need to ban assault weapons and high capacity ammunition magazines that are putting our children, their parents, and our staff at risk! We want to see the laws improve at the state and federal levels. We support the efforts of our legislators as they stand up for greater safety, and stronger laws against gun violence for the sake of our students! We want our children protected!

We hope other regions and state ACSA speak out and join us in an effort to influence our legislators to take action. As retired administrators we need to set an example and speak up!
