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Attention Retirees and Future Retirees!

Windfall Elimination Provision & Government Pension Offset (WEP/GPO)

Many ACSA retirees and STRS members may not even be aware of the Windfall Elimination Provision and the Government Pension Offset — two federal laws that are unfairly reducing retirement benefits for public servants and their spouses. Now, as Congress is set to take up legislation to overturn these rules, the ACSA Retirement Committee is asking for help in protecting the retirement incomes of former, current and future educators.

"Our State Retirement Committee strongly supports the full repeal of the two Social Security penalties: WEP and GPO," said Kathleen McCreery, chair of the ACSA Retirement Committee. "These Social Security benefit reductions have had a significant negative impact on the ability to recruit and retain teachers that are entering the profession as a second career and they negatively impact all educators for choosing a career of public service."

The WEP legislation was enacted in 1977 and is till in the books! In 2018 over 250,000 Californians were affected. There have been many unsuccessful efforts to eliminate this injustice over the years. Even if you are not retiring any time soon, this issue may impact you when the time becomes.

"This is not a retiree issue. If not corrected it will affect every educator who will retire in the next 50 years or more. Get active — do this for yourself and those who will follow." - Alice Petrossian, retirement committee liaison

Karen: Maybe give it a try when a position is suggested to you. Sometimes mentors will tap you and suggest positions to you. You may decline because you do not want to be pigeon-holed into the work others may see you do well in, but instead you may want to give it a try.

Lynn: You just be YOU! Like yourself! Like who you are. Be YOU! (If you are a quiet leader, it's okay!)

L.K. Monroe: Show up as a leader - even though you don't have all of the right answers!

Training for Paraprofessionals -Keys to a Successful Transition Back to the Classroom

After more than a year of disrupted learning caused by the pandemic, the need to support children's mental health and academic achievement has never been greater. Students will require extra care and attention from all adults; everyone from principals, teachers and classroom staff, including paraprofessionals.

Paraprofessionals are the glue that hold the classroom community together. They assist by providing daily instructional, speech-language, health, motor and behavioral support to students. The National Education Association reported that roughly 80% of paraprofessionals work with students with disabilities and as such, they will play a critical role in paving the way for a successful transition back to in-person learning.

Training paraprofessionals should be a priority for every school district to support a smooth transition. Specifically, professional development focused on understanding and managing behaviors will be beneficial for students and the entire school community.

For example, when SPG, a multidisciplinary services provider, collaborated with Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) to provide a series of eight behavior-related trainings in 2020-21 to approximately 200 paraprofessionals, data from attendee feedback showed that:

• 96% would use what they learned in the classroom

• 73% reporting a high level of confidence after the training vs. 33% reported a high level of confidence in behavior-related material prior to training
