ACSA One Voice for Students and Legislative Platform Updated

The One Voice for Students Initiative was developed and adopted in 2014 by the Superintendency Council in an effort to unify superintendents around key areas; thus ensuring school leaders speak with one voice on issues such as student outcomes; human resources; and school funding. In recent years, the initiative aimed to unify all ACSA members around prominent policy issues.

ACSA's Legislative Platform, adopted every two years, established the advocacy priorities for the organization during the state and congressional sessions, which guides the work of ACSA Governmental Relations staff.

In an effort to align the One Voice for Students and the Legislative Platform, they were combined to create a joint process and one document to inform lawmakers of the organization's highest education priorities. The One Voice for Students 2021-2022 Legislative Platform was developed with input from ACSA membership and reviewed and edited by the Legislative Platform Working Group and the Legislative Policy Committee and then submitted for ratification by the Leadership Assembly and approval of the ACSA Board of Directors.

This document was recently updated and approved. The priority areas for ACSA advocacy are:

- Keeping Schools Safely Open
- Equity-Centered Educational Practices
- Wellness and Mental Health
- Educator Staffing Crisis
- School Funding
- School Facilities and safety
- Special Education
- Universal Transitional Kindergarten Implementation

A Model of Success - Val Verde USD

Led by Superintendent Mike McCormick and Assistant Superintendent for Education Services, Mark LeNoir, Val Verde Unified School District has developed multiple strategies to implement equity initiatives throughout their school district.

Val Verde Unified School District is located in the heart of the Inland Empire, approximately 72 miles east of Los Angeles. It's schools serve more than 19,000 students residing in the rural and suburban communities of Perris, Moreno Valley, and portions of unincorporated Riverside County. The district currently operates a preschool, 12 elementary schools, 4 middle schools, 3 comprehensive high schools, a student success academy, a virtual academy, and a continuation high school. 83% of the students are identified as socioeconomically disadvantaged and 19% are English learners. Nearly 78% of their students are Hispanic and African American students represent over 12% of the district's enrollment.

At the February 17 ACSA Leadership Assembly, ACSA Sr. Director of Equity Adonai Mack invited the Val Verde team to share their strategies that led to the implementation of a policy to make FAFSA a graduation requirement, implementation of their ethnic studies program prior to state legislative mandate, and how they have utilized mindful conversations to discuss race and improve the mental wellness of their students and staff. They also shared their approach to parent/family engagement with an emphasis on their African American families.

Val Verde has become a model district for staying true to their mission to become a district that creates a positive environment that produces life-long learners who will become responsible, contributing citizens able to function in a culturally diverse society.
