The 3Ps: Intersectional Identities and the Impact of Stress

Building on the Human Function Curve framework introduced in the previous Teaching Well PD, participants explore the ways in which stress compounds and stores in the nervous system, especially for caregivers. The 3 Ps training facilitates reflection exploring the intersection of our personal, professional, and provider responsibilities and culminates in a scaffolded stress management work burst.
