He would continue to support school administrators at ACSA. He served as the Region 6's Consultant along side of Executive Bob Giannini until he retired again in 2015. John will be remembered for his leadership, positive attitude, and sense of

From Your Region Executive Director



The Rights of California School Administrators

I was able to attend a "back by popular demand" session on Administrator Rights at the Leadership Summit. I have attended this session many times and always found the information invaluable. This is one of the most important benefit for ACSA members. Here is a summary of the presentation.

The ACSA Member Assistance & Legal Support Team (MALST) assists approximately 800 members every school year on a variety of issues. This past year, 125 members asked for assistance in dealing with March 15 Notices (Demotion/Reassignment/Termination) and/or a Non-Reelect Notice; 19 needed assistance with Settlement Agreements; 92 administrators requested assistance with being placed on Administrative Leave due to a complaint filed against them; 31 members needed help with allegations filed against them with the CTC; 30 called about a staff member filing a complaint against them, and 43 called regarding discord with their supervisor.

The MALST is made up of 7 extremely knowlegeable advocates with many years of experience at all levels. At the presentation, the team shared 8 actual scenarios representative of the cases that come to them. I recommend reading these scenarios because they will sound familiar and relevant to most of us.
