### Here's Efa's account of this honor:





# From Region 6 Executive Director

### There is no better time to join ACSA than NOW!

ACSA is again running a promotion for new certificated and classified members. "New Member" is defined as any applicant who has never been a member or was not a member for the last 12 months. Dues will be \$2 a day for certificated and \$1 a day for classified new members in this first year of membership.

Region 6 was awarded ACSA rebate incentives for our growth of membership in 2024-25. Your Executive Committee voted to allocate some of these funds to help grow our region's membership.
