- The California Department of Education's 11 Elements of High Quality CTE
 Programs is being revised by the Career Workforce Pathways Joint Advisory
 Committee. The revised version should be out by the end of this school
 year.
- One of the provisions of the new Perkins V legislation is the requirement that each LEA conduct a Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment (CLNA) of all of the LEA's Career Technical Education programs. The CLNA will be the foundation upon which all future CTE grant requests will be based. The CDE will be issuing guidance on completion of the CLNA in early Spring 2020.
- The focus of Perkins V will be on serving special needs populations.
- The CDE is working on creating a universal application to be used by LEAs for all CTE funding sources. This would include Perkins, CTE Incentive Grant, and K-12 Strong Workforce.
- A recently completed research study showed that students who took articulated courses in high school performed no better in post-secondary education than those who did not. Any implications of this study have yet to be determined.
- The ACSA CTE Council has appointed a sub-committee to develop recommendations for the promotion of Career Technical Education in California.
