# Mother Lode Charter of Region 7 ACSA Bylaws

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ARTICLE I<br>Name, Principal Office, Purpose, and Restrictions<br>1.01 Name. The name of the charter is Association of California Administrators, Region VII, Mother Lode Charter, geographical division of the Association of California School Administrators ("State ACSA") including the counties of Amador and Calaveras. In this document, the Mother Lode Charter is referred to as the "Charter"<br>1.02 Purposes. The general purpose of this regional association is to promote the advancement of education; therefore, it subscribes to the general purposes of ACSA and promotes objectives and policies of State ACSA.<br>1.03 Restrictions. All policies and activities of the region shall be consistent with:<br>1. State ACSA bylaws, policies, and standing rules.<br>2. Applicable federal, state, and local antitrust and trade regulation laws.<br>3. Applicable tax-exemption requirements.<br>4. All other legal requirements including the California Nonprofit Corporation Law under which State ACSA is incorporated and to which the regions are subject.

## ARTICLE II Organization

2.01 Bylaws. The Charter Bylaws shall be consistent with the State ACSA Bylaws.

Governance: The Charter shall have a governing Board of Directors composed of the President, President Elect, Vice President/Legislative Action, Vice President/Programs, VP/Membership, Secretary, Treasurer, and Immediate Past President.
2.03 Functions. The functions of the Charter shall be to promote within Amador and Calaveras Counties the purposes of ACSA as stated in these Bylaws, with programs and activities similar to and consistent with those of State ACSA.
2.04 Charters. This Charter within Region VII shall be issued by the Region Board in accordance with standards in the Policies and Standing Rules of ACSA.

## ARTICLE III <br> Membership

3.01 Membership Qualifications. Membership in ACSA is extended to persons who have professional involvement in leadership responsibility in education including persons in training, supporting and consulting services as provided in this article.
3.02 Membership Privileges. Regular members shall have voting privileges and be eligible to serve as officers, directors, or committee members at state, region, and charter levels; other privileges of regular membership shall be set forth in the Policies and Procedures.

The privileges of membership of all other classes of members other than regular members shall be set forth in the Policies and Procedures.
3.03 Regular Membership. Regular membership shall be extended to persons employed in California as follows:
a. Those employees in a school district or other educational agency designated or functioning as management employees, members of the management team, confidential employees or certificated supervisory employees.
b. Professors of Education. Those full-time professors of educational administration who elect regular membership pursuant to Bylaw 3.09.
c. Regular members on leave/sabbatical who are committed to return to active employment as set forth in (1) and (2).
Retired Membership. Retired membership shall be extended to: ACSA members not currently employed in the field of education, but receiving compensation from the State Retirement System or Public Employees Retirement System and ACSA members who have been certified as being totally and permanently disabled.
3.04 Honorary Life Membership. The Board may award a Motherlode Charter Honorary Life Membership to persons making an outstanding contribution to education.
3.05 Associate Membership. Associate membership shall be extended to individuals not eligible for regular membership as follows:
a. ACSA members reassigned to the classroom or other duties outside administration/supervision.
b. Individuals meeting credential requirements for membership but who have not yet been employed in a position qualifying them for regular membership.
c. Consultant membership: Available to educational consultants.
d. Part-time employees employed under an early retirement program who would otherwise qualify under Section 3.02.
e. Complimentary membership. Granted to ACSA professional staff upon appointment.
f. Former ACSA members not qualifying under other membership categories.
g. Other individuals as approved by the Board.
3.06 Student Membership. Student membership is extended to individuals who are graduate students verified to be enrolled in programs of Education Administration leading to an administrative credential in an accredited institution of higher learning.
3.07 Organizational Membership. Organizational membership is extended to organizations involved in concerns regarding education services or programs whose members are not otherwise eligible for Regular membership.
3.08 Professors of Educational Administration Membership. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws to the contrary, full-time professors of educational administration shall be entitled to elect membership status as either regular members or associate members.
3.09 Consolidated Membership. Consolidated membership is extended to those persons who meet regular ACSA membership requirements under Section 3.02 and are active members of a local administrator association that meets the requirements established by the Board.
3.10 Discipline. A member may be disciplined (which discipline may include private or public reprimand, suspension, or expulsion) based on the good faith determination by the Board, or a committee or person authorized by the Board to make such a determination, that the member has failed in a material and serious degree to observe the Association's rules of conduct, or is engaged in conduct materially and seriously prejudicial to the purposes and interests of the Association, provided that the Board adopt appropriate procedures that meet or exceed the standards set forth in California Corporations Code Section 7341.

## ARTICLE IV Charter Board of Directors

4.01 Responsibilities. The Charter Board is the governing body of the Charter and has authority and responsibility for the supervision, control, and direction of the charter area.
4.02 Composition. The composition of the Charter Directors shall be the Executive Officers (including President, President-Elect, Vice President/Legislative Action, Vice President/Programs, Secretary, Treasurer, and immediate Past President).
4.03 Executive Officers. The Executive Officers (except the Immediate Past President) and the Directors shall be elected by the general membership of Region VII.
4.04 Meetings. Charter Directors shall meet no less than three times per year.
4.05 Notice. Charter Directors may hold regular meetings if the time and place of such meetings is fixed by the Directors. The Directors may hold special meetings upon sufficient notice as set by the Directors.
4.06 Quorum. A quorum of Directors shall be the number of Directors present at any of the regularly called meetings.
4.07 Charter Action. Every act or decision done or made by a majority of the Charter Directors present at a meeting duly held at which a quorum is present is the act of the Charter Directors.
4.08 Powers. The Charter Directors shall exercise all the powers, duties and policies established by the State Delegate Assembly and the Region Delegate Assembly and/or authorized by these bylaws. It shall have the rights of corporate directors, subject to the limitations and restrictions provided by these bylaws.

## ARTICLE V Officers

5.01 Officers. The officers of the Charter shall be President, President-Elect, VicePresident/Programs, Vice President/Legislative Action, Vice President/Membership Secretary, Treasurer, and Immediate Past President.
Qualifications. Officers must be regular members of ACSA.
Terms of Office. The following will be terms of office for the officers of the Region:

5.04 Charter Directors Term of Office. The term of office for the Charter Directors will be for two years on a rotating basis. One Director will be elected each year for a two-year term.
Beginning Date for Term of Office. The term of office for the Executive Officers and Directors shall begin on June 1 following the date of election.
5.06 Duties of Officers and Charter Directors. The duties of the officers of Region VII, not otherwise prescribed, shall be as usually pertained to such officers.
a. President - The Mother Lode Charter President shall preside over meetings of the Charter Directors and the general membership sessions. The President may call special meetings of Charter Directors, and the general membership. The President shall be an ex-officio member of all committees, except the Nominations Committee.
b. President-Elect - The President-Elect shall be an aide to the President and shall, in the absence of the President, fulfill the duties of the office. The President-Elect shall automatically succeed as President at the conclusion of the term as President-Elect. The President-Elect shall be an ex-officio member of all
committees. The President-Elect shall have responsibility for committee oversight, Region Director Liaison, and the Scholarship Committee.
c. Vice President/Programs - The Vice President/Programs is a member of the Program Committee and shall be responsible for helping plan and develop conferences, and approving Charter professional development activities.
d. Vice-President/Legislative Action - The Vice President/Legislative Action be a member of the Region VII Legislative Action Committee and will be responsible for all actions pertinent to legislative activities in the Charter and at the State. The Vice President/Legislative Action is responsible for helping coordinate the annual Legislative Action Day in Sacramento for Region VII.
e. Vice-President/Membership - The Vice President/Membership shall be responsible for recruiting, developing, and maintaining members in the local Charter and work closely with the state Member Services Representative for the area.
f. Secretary - The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of the minutes of all meetings and the standing rules and shall be responsible for their preservation. The Secretary shall assure that minutes of Charter Director meetings are mailed to the membership following each meeting. The Secretary may request the appointment of an assistant, subject to the approval of the Charter Board
g. Treasurer - The Treasurer shall maintain an accurate record of all fiscal transactions of Motherlode Charter, shall prepare financial reports for each general membership meeting, and shall submit the Treasurer's records for annual audit by July 31. The Treasurer shall develop a preliminary budget for approval by the Charter Directors at its first meeting
h. Immediate Past President - The Immediate Past President shall serve as parliamentarian at all meetings, shall chair the Nominating Committee, assist in coordination of membership activities of the Region, and shall have other duties as assigned by the President.
i. Charter Directors - One Vice President/Director shall serve as member of the Nominating Committee, and one Vice President/Director shall serve on the Conference Committee,
j. General Duties of Officers. All officers of the Charter shall maintain all records, correspondence etc. and shall deliver them to their successors not later than May 31 unless special arrangements are made.
5.07 Eligibility to Office. Any regular member of Mother Lode Charter shall be eligible to hold office in this organization.
5.08 Nominations.
a. The Nominating Committee shall be composed of the Charter Directors under the chair of the President.
b. The President shall submit to the Charter Directors, at the first meeting of each calendar year, a proposed timeline for the nomination and election of elective officers. Said time line shall include the mailing of ballots by March 15.
b. Nominations for the elective officers of Mother Lode Charter shall be made by the Nominating Committee. This committee shall submit to the Charter membership no later than the second meeting of the year the names of one or more candidates for each office to be filled. The general membership shall be notified of these names by letter. This letter will include information on procedures for additional nominations.
c. Additional Nominations to any open elective office may be made by any Charter member. Such nominations must be received by the President by February 15.
d. A list of additional nominees (if any) will be prepared and sent out to the general membership with the ballot, if such ballots are necessary due to contested positions.
Elections.
a. If a position is contested, the Charter Nominating Committee shall provide mailed ballots to Mother Lode Charter members for an election by March 15. Ballots shall be returned to said Committee by April 1. The Committee shall conduct the election tabulation and report the results to the general membership.
b. Charter elections shall be held as convenient to the Region Election calendar as possible. Completed election of charter officers, and names thereto, shall be submitted to the Region President by May 1.
5.10 Vacancies. In case of a vacancy of the office of President, the President-Elect shall succeed to the office of President and serve the remainder of the term and the following year. In case of a vacancy in the office of President-Elect, the position shall be filled by one of the then-current Vice Presidents (to be decided by the full Cabinet) and announced at the next meeting of the Charter. All other vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the Charter Directors.
5.12 Powers, Duties, and Function of Region VII Delegate Assembly.
a. Govern the operation of Mother Lode Charter.
b. Establish and implement Charter policies.
c. Approve political candidate endorsements.
d. Endorse and support legislative action.
e. Maintain a record of the proceedings of all meetings of the Charter Directors.
f. Define the responsibilities of all committees.
g. Authorize all publications of Motherlode Charter.
h. Inform the general membership of the adoption of amendments to the Bylaws of the Motherlode Charter
i. Approve the Charter calendar.
j. Recall Charter Executive Officers and Directors for just cause.
k. Exercise other powers and perform other duties as may be provided by these Bylaws.

## ARTICLE VI

Charter Formation
8.01 Eligibility. Any local organization within Region VII with active members from union high school districts and elementary districts within these boundaries, unified school districts, county offices, and/or any combination thereof is eligible to apply for a Charter of affiliation as a Charter.
8.02 Procedure of Application.
a. A letter of application stating boundaries, active membership, and a copy of the proposed Bylaws shall be submitted to the Secretary of Region VII.
b. Upon approval of the application by the Region Delegate Assembly, the application shall be forwarded to State ACSA for action.
8.03 Presentation of Charter Region VII shall, upon the receipt of the Charter from State $\overline{\text { ACSA, make an appropriate presentation to the newly affiliated charter and shall seat its }}$ representatives as provided in these Bylaws.
