State revenues have improved, but still caution recommended, as State still faces a deficit for 2024-25. <u>https://www.lao.ca.gov/LAOEconTax/Article/Detail/785</u>

Data indicates that CA was in a mild recession around the Fall of 2022 and 1st quarter of 2023. 2024-25 Estimated COLA at 2% range, but 3 more quarters of data to lockdown. Frustrating that moving tax deadline.

V. Bargaining & Local Pressures

Patti Herrera, Ed.D., Vice President, School Services of California Mike Fine, FCMAT

- 2023/24 must risky budget action in more than a decade.
- Pressure at the table and intense to even reopen 22/23 to get part of historical 8% COLA. 17 districts in bay area, orchestrating to support each other's demands.
- Attendance Yield protections start to diminish, high cost increases to benefit costs putting pressure on costs.
- TK 10:1 ratio req'd and no longer contingent on funding, plus the roll back for eligible birthdates to be enrolled.
- Equity Multiplier No updates on data beyond the budget act. Tied to CALPADS YE data point has been delayed and no new information until CALPADS report to be published.
- Be mindful of COLA and declining enrollment
