- Who:** The Region 8 ACSA Awards Committee would like to begin recognizing ACSA 1st year Superstar Administrators from each school district from the 2017-2018 school year. Each Superstar will be recognized at the Region 8 ACSA Awards dinner, Friday May 11, 2018.
- What:** We ask each district Superintendent or designee to submit the name of your district Superstar by **Friday, April 6, 2018 at 4:00 pm** to acsaaward@metroed.net
(See simple criteria below)
- Why:** Being a first-year administrator is very difficult, and we want to encourage our Superstars to continue to aspire in their current role and future roles.
- Administrators do not receive a lot of recognition.
 - This is an opportunity to recognize an individual and your district at the same time.
- When:** Recognition: Friday, May 11, 2018, 5:00-10:00 pm
- Each **ACSA Award recipient** is free and may bring one free guest.
 - The guest does not need to be an ACSA member.
 - Any additional guests that are not ACSA members will pay \$50.00.
- Where:** ACSA Awards Dinner: Corinthian Grand Ballroom, Downtown San Jose, 196 North 3rd Street, San Jose, CA 95112

Award Recipient/District Criteria:

- ACSA Member or Non-ACSA Member
- Completing their first year as a school administrator. (Example: a first time administrator, not a promotion from one administrative position to a new administrative position, they should not have had any other administrative position at all)
- Examples of positions that qualify are: Coordinator, Dean, Assistant Principal, Assistant Principal, Vice Principal, Principal or equivalent. (Districts are not limited to those titles, but they must be an administrator for the first time.)
- Superintendent or designee must submit 2-3 sentences about why the person is a Superstar and should be recognized.
