
Hope you are planning to attend our Annual Fall Conference. It is

Buttonwillow Union School District and California State University have joined together to follow through on a grant that was provided by Kaiser Permanente. The grant provided for 30 Fit Desks which are exercise bikes with a desk affixed to the front. Also included in the grant, and subsequent study are 30 Fit Bit fitness bracelets. The goal

of the grant is to measure the fitness of students. This will be done by bringing all 4th through 8th grade students to the Kinesiology Lab on the CSUB campus to measure body composition. During the study the education staff and interns from CSUB will continue to measure fitness data. Additionally they will undertake studies with regard to reading. During this time the students will be screened on reading performance. As the students exercise, and continue to read further testing will be done to identify any correlation between student fitness and improved student performance. Currently, a similar study is being undertaken at two schools on the East Coast. The relationship between CSUB and Buttonwillow will bring together the only study on the West Coast in this area.

- 4. Receiving a membership report of update given by David Tonini, Executive Director Region XI.


Each of the region's five local charters are being encouraged to have delegates who will have responsibility of attending and participants at the Three Region XI.




