1. Welcome

Katie McNamara, Superintendents' Council President

- ACSA State Leadership Assembly this week others in other meetings
- Thanked Black Leaders across ACSA for their critical leadership during Black History Month

2. Update on Reopening Negotiations

Edgar Zazueta, Senior Director, ACSA Policy & Governmental Relations

- ACSA members have been reaching out to legislative leaders having an impact
- If it is a deal that makes it more difficult to open or causes some to close that is not good for anyone
- Hearing that negotiations are very fluid still far from a done deal
 - Asm McCarty got ahead of his party a bit and talked about a deal. Not sure if it is true in Senate
 - Discussion about incentivizing LEA's neediest students in purple (nothing definitive)
 - Not hearing about restrictions for districts opening in purple
 - o Stronger incentive to serve TK-6 (nothing definitive) in red tier
 - Will still allow for distance learning
 - Still talking about \$2B incentive grant
 - Governor has been adamant that vaccine is not a precondition for reopening
 - Some discussions around giving priority to those in schools or preparing to open?
 - Testing cadence still needs advocacy
 - Legislative still holding to CDPH guidelines
 - Concern that may hold up some reopenings
 - Still not sure if new deal will create additional demands to bargain
- CTA did a media buy in the past few days around schools not being safe to reopen yet
 - Creating some challenges related to recall effort

3. CDC Guidelines

Edgar Zazueta, Senior Director, ACSA Policy & Governmental Relations

- CDC California K-12 Schools Guidance Crosswalk
 - With right mitigation strategies safe to have in person instruction
- Believe that state plan will try to find alignment with CDC plan

4. Assessments: Request for Waiver

Diana Vu, ACSA Governmental Relations

- CA does not have confirmation from Federal Govt around testing waiver
- Concern about learning loss
- SBE and CDE now anticipating we won't get a waiver
 - State Looking at 3 options
 - Extending window until July 30th
 - Opening new window at beginning of year 10/30
 - Utilizing an alternative test
- ACSA is asking leaders to make calls or write letters prior to next Wednesday's Board CDE Meetings
 - SBE Meeting for February 24, 2021
 - o SBE Public comment guidelines
 - Can virtually give one minute of testimony
- Possible that CDE is just exploring options in case, but very concerned
- All statewide education coalition in agreement and working together
