ACSA REGION XV ACSA ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIP

ACSA REGION XV ROBERT GRAY SERVICE AWARD

Purpose: The Robert Gray Service Award is in the highest honor ACSA Region XV can present to an individual. This award is made in memory of Robert Gray, who was involved in the formation of ACSA, an umbrella organization for seven organizations, which became operative July 1, 1971. Bob Gray was Region XV's first president in 1971-1972. Bob Gray became region consultant in 1976 and he retired from that position in June 1993. At the time, the Region Board voted to honor him with an annual award in his name. He was the first recipient.

Purpose: To honor the memory of the first ACSA Region XV President Robert Gray.

Process: The recipient of the Robert Gray Service Award will name a graduating secondary school student(s) of his/her choice within Region XV to be the recipient(s) totaling \$1,000 for the Robert Gray Scholarship. The scholarship is to be used towards expenses related to higher education associated with preparation as a teacher.

Nomination Process: The Executive Board will notify the recipient of the Robert Gray Service Award of the Scholarship.

The Robert Gray Service Award recipient will notify the Region Controller of the name(s) of the Scholarship student(s) (one \$1,000 scholarship, or two \$500 scholarships, or four \$250 scholarships); provide student(s) name and complete address.

In addition, send a letter/memo to the Controller from the student's counselor on school letterhead indicating that the student is 1) a graduating senior, and 2) will be attending college with the intention of becoming a teacher.

The Controller will work with the Robert Gray Service Award recipient in delivering/mailing checks to the Scholarship student(s) or arranging for presentation to the student(s) at a school awards event.

ACSA REGION XV DAVID G. MILLEN MENTORING AWARD

Purpose: The ACSA Region XV David G. Millen Mentoring Award is presented in memory of long-time ACSA member David G. Millen, who succumbed to Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) on May 21, 2004. David G. Millen promoted ACSA through his years of service at the Region level and as an active member of the Antelope Valley Charter.

This award is to be presented annually to an individual who best exemplifies the principles of mentoring that David G. Millen modeled. The recipient will name an aspiring administrator (current ACSA member or willing to join to receive this scholarship) who is to receive up to \$1,000 to attend an ACSA activity (Leadership Summit, an ACSA Conference, Principal's Summer Institute, etc.).

Eligibility: An active ACSA member with long and ongoing service and leadership.

Nomination Process: Submit nominations on the attached award form with required documentation to the Region XV President-Elect for consideration by the Region Awards Committee.

Process: The recipient of the David G. Millen Mentoring Award will name an aspiring administrator (current ACSA member of willing to join to receive this scholarship) of his/her choice within Region XV to be the recipient totaling \$1,000 for the David G. Millen Mentoring Scholarship to be used towards the recipient's education. The individual will attend and complete an ACSA event (Leadership Summit, an ACSA Conference, Principal's Summer Institute etc.). She involves her staff and the school community in an effort to create a vision that we can make a difference.
