- 1. Building the Leadership Capacity of High School Assistant Principals
 - a. Discussion: How are we using our APs?
 - b. Are the Academies too expensive for assistant principals? could there be mini academies that are more affordable?
 - c. Some principals share their responsibilities with APs, and other sites do not have a developed program.
 - d. On the job training is the most valuable and is dependent on the principal.
 - e. Creating networking opportunities for AP is invaluable.
 - f. Title 2 funds can be used for administrators to help develop learning opportunities (use Title 2 to help with clearing admin credentials) federal addendum to the LCAP.
 - g. Some districts have specific AP roles with job descriptions principal must cross-train.
 - h. Principals can pay from district or site budget funds for various academies i.e.: attend state ACSA Summit.
 - Allow the APs to do the work you are doing and be an extension of you so they can be seen as future principals by staff - allow them to lead in core directions and lead you.
 - j. In the Principal's Academy, add how to train up APs as one of the topics teach us how to be coaches or mentors.
- 2. ESSA, CA School Dashboard College and Career Readiness
 - a. Advocate up about CDE is arriving at CCI push the advocacy piece now.
 - b. Is there a dashboard being released this year?
 - c. Should this be put on hold since it is not as relevant this year?
 - d. Equity issues for students of color or small/rural schools where there are not as many opportunities.
 - e. Current CCI does not make sense for all schools across the board
 - f. Some schools are getting rid of class rankings.

 - Lori Phone calls home, new interactive programs like Peardeck. Don't make kids passive observers, they must interact. No more sit and get - they have to engage constantly.
 - Victor hard to engage kids phone calls happen but not always working, hard to see the hope. Lecturing is getting more involved - those that are engaging and getting kids to turn things in is making a difference.
 - Angela Padlet, Peardeck breakout rooms with TAs or student teachers. At the site administration level - immense amount of SSTs and IEP amendments to talk

about lack of attendance and engagement - support staff supervised kids in the computer lab to help out with technology.

- Tim Switched from semester to quarter it is really helping the kids to only focus on 3 classes at a time easier for teachers to hunt down kids who are not engaged this has been really successful. Waiver for PE instructional minutes.
- Matt Planning for credit recovery for January. Students who fail at the semester will
 do Edunuity, and teachers will be handpicked to do that. Struggles with staff not
 teaching in a traditional way during distance learning.
- Victor District already has the split from August and created cohorts even kids in home base or 100% online learning can compete with their home school.
- Angela clubs are coming back on campus and athletes are conditioning

- Need to have families make a commitment do Town Hall meetings then do the survey to plan based on the results of the survey.
