



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Report from Region 6 ACSA Board Representative Parvin Ahmadi

How does ACSA represent us in the legislative process?

The ACSA Board of Directors ratified the two-year *One Voice For Students* legislative platform that was approved by the Leadership Assembly, which is focused on pandemic response and supporting schools along the continuum.

In previous years, the One Voice for Students Initiative and Legislative Platform were developed independently of each other. The One Voice for Students Initiative was developed and adopted in 2014 by the Superintendency Council in an effort to unify superintendents around key areas; thus ensuring school leaders speak with one voice on issues such as student outcomes; human resources; and school funding. In recent years, the initiative aimed to unify all ACSA members around prominent policy issues.

In an effort to align the One Voice for Students and the Legislative Platform, they were combined to create a joint process and one document to inform lawmakers of the organization's highest education priorities. The One Voice for Students 2019-2020 Legislative Platform was developed with input from ACSA membership and reviewed and edited by the Legislative Platform Working Group and the Legislative Policy Committee and then submitted for ratification by the Leadership Assembly and

approval of the ACSA Board of Directors.

The development of the Legislative Platform is heavily underscored by the current efforts to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic which has fundamentally impacted the nature of public education in California. As such, there is no greater immediate focus than supporting schools as they are challenged to serve student needs by providing distance learning and moving forward with the school reopening process. The mission remains by ensuring students have equitable access to in-person education when their respective communities' health situation stabilizes is a paramount objective for the current legislative session.
