The Middle Grades Education Council is charged with the following mission:

- To identify and study issues relating to middle grades administrators and to recommend practices and policies which will lead to high quality programs for young adolescents.
- To strengthen a network for communication among middle grades administrators.
- To plan, provide, and encourage professional development programs for middle grades administrators.
- To assist in the recruitment of middle grades administrators as ACSA members.
- To encourage interaction and support between ACSA, the National Association of Secondary School Principals, the California Department of Education, and other organizations and agencies promoting the interests of middle grades education.

Mistee is the Principal of Edendale Middle School in the San Lorenzo USD and has been a dedicated ACSA member since the beginning of her administrative career. Being an ACSA leader has allowed her to learn and network with other educational leaders and influence policy makers across the state and truly make a difference for our students in California.
