STATE ACSA BOARD

The **State ACSA Board** met Thursday and Friday, May 10 and 11, to conduct leadership training and hold the Board meeting.

The Board took input we had solicited from the region for my vote on the member services realignment. Our region made it very clear to me that I should be supporting the realignment. ACSA is ramping up outreach efforts to non-members via email blasts. A blast is scheduled twice each month and is aimed at nearly 3,800 potential Regular and Consolidated members. Out of 5,000

names in our non-member database, there are about 1,200 without email information. Those names will be part of a mailing campaign and other recruitment strategies. This week the **Education Coalition** met with members of the administration to discuss the governor's plan for switching to a weighted student formula (WSF). Modifications to the WSF represent a significant improvement from the January proposal, but there are still a many questions that need to be answered regarding implementation. I will give feedback on this at the next Board meeting.

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Secondary Principal of the Year - Dr. Cheryl Domenichelli, Kimball High School, Tracy Unified School District


