Nicole Anderson has served in varying roles in education for more than 20 years around the state and nation. She began her career in Vallejo Unified School District as a high school teacher, activities director, and basketball coach and eventually spent the latter years of her work as a school site leader serving in the roles of high school dean/assistant principal and vice principal, as well as elementary principal. Her unique leadership skills and broad range of experiences launched her into becoming a highly qualified developer and facilitator of professional learning services as well as a dedicated advocate for educational and racial equity work. Most notable, she served as the first Equity Executive in the history of the Association of California School Administrators (ACSA), which created a unique platform for the development of a culture and movement around equity focused work in the state. This included her facilitation of ACSA's and CSBA's state-wide equity networks as well as a cadre of equity focused professional development services for educators and school community stakeholders of diverse backgrounds.



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
