Annual Spring Conference Coming Soon by Kelene Blevins, Conference Chair


The Annual ACSA Region 7 **Spring Conference** returns to **South Lake** Tahoe from May 2-4, 2025, bringing together educational leaders for a weekend of professional development, collaboration, and celebration. The event kicks off on Friday, May 2, with a Women's Leadership Breakfast featuring Dr. Trudy Arriaga, who will speak on Leading While Female. Following breakfast, the conference begins at 9:30 a.m. with a State of Education Panel moderated by Scott Nanik, Superintendent of Bret Harte Union High School District. Panelists Leilani Aguinaldo, Serette Kaminski, Barrett Snider, and Michael Fine will discuss key issues impacting education at the state and federal levels. Attendees will then have the opportunity to participate in a variety of breakout sessions led by local administrators.

In the afternoon, Shari Murphy will deliver a keynote address on Rooted Resilience: Grounded Fulfillment & Joy in Education (2:30-3:45 PM), helping leaders navigate the demands of education while maintaining balance, purpose, and intentional leadership. The evening will conclude with the President's Awards Dinner, where we will honor Region 7 awardees for their outstanding contributions to education.

On Saturday, May 3, the conference continues with additional breakout sessions, followed by a keynote presentation from Julie Winkle Giulioni (10:15-11:45 AM) titled Beyond Promotions: A Multidimensional Approach to Career Growth for School Leaders. This session challenges traditional career advancement models and provides fresh perspectives on professional growth. The day will close with our Annual Kentucky Derby Soiree, where attendees can enjoy the race, dress up in Derby attire, and participate in the Kentucky Derby Hat Parade. Derby squares will be sold for \$5 each to support student scholarships.

The conference concludes on Sunday, May 4, with a keynote from Dr. Dominique Smith (8:30-10:00 AM) on Sense of Belonging. This session will explore strategies for fostering inclusive, supportive school communities where every student feels valued and empowered.

With engaging speakers, insightful discussions, and meaningful networking opportunities, the Spring Conference promises to be an unforgettable experience. See you in South Lake Tahoe for a weekend of inspiration and growth!

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
